**RE: Notice of One-Year Disciplinary Probation (Winter 2015, Spring 2015, Summer 2015, Fall 2015, Winter 2016)**

Dear Laura Tull:

On February 2, 2015, the Office of Student Judicial Affairs received a conduct report which stated that on Saturday, January 31, 2015, you sent Counselor Cliff Dobbs an email regarding several pages of non-college related information about yourself and other organizations.

In your Student Judicial Affairs Notice of Written Reprimand, that was sent to you after our October 9, 2014 meeting, you were instructed to "Do not send college officials numerous inappropriate emails". I also verbally instructed you to have no form of communication with Mr. Dobbs. The Notice of Written Reprimand served as a warning which stated "continued misconduct will result in further disciplinary actions against you, including suspension from the college". Therefore, you are hereby notified that you have been placed on **Disciplinary Probation** for one school year beginning Winter 2015 through Winter 2016.

Your January 31, 2015 emails to Mr. Dobbs was in violation of the Santa Monica College Administrative Regulations (AR) 4410, Rules for Student Conduct, and Student Judicial Affairs instructions to you.

1. (A). Continuous disruptive behavior, continued willful disobedience, habitual profanity or vulgarity, persistent abuse of other students, or the open and persistent defiance of the authority of , or persistent abuse of, college personnel [E.C. 76033 (a)]
2. (G). Persistent, serious misconduct where other means of correction have failed to bring about proper conduct. [E.C. 76033 (f)]
3. (L). Willful or blatant misuse of email or other inappropriate forms of communication towards faculty, staff or students including but not limited to phone, voicemail, written notes and any form of electronic communication.

**If you are reported for any form of misconduct within your disciplinary probationary period (winter 2015 through winter 2016), and if it is determined that you violated the college's student conduct regulations, you will be suspended from Santa Monica College for up to two school years.**

Given this incident, and your violation of our Rules for Student Conduct (AR 4410), you are hereby advised that:

- If you so choose, you may write a response to this Notice of Disciplinary Probation and the response will be placed on record with the Notice of Disciplinary Probation.
- With respect to disciplinary probation, AR 4410 provides that there shall be no further hearing or appeal.
