**RE: Written Reminder of Rules of Student Conduct and your Disciplinary Probation Sanction**

Dear Ms. Tull:

This letter is a reminder that you are still on Disciplinary Probation through winter 2016. This sanction was imposed on you due to your continued misuse of college email and inappropriate communication with faculty. In **October 2014** you were issued a Written Reprimand (warning) for your misconduct, and in **February 2015**, you were placed on Disciplinary Probation for repeated violations.

In early September of this year, it was brought to my attention that once again you are sending inappropriate and non-class related emails to another college faculty member. I have reviewed your email to Professor Carrasco and find that much of the content is disturbing, and it is an extremely inappropriate form of communicating with your instructor. You write to Professor Carrasco about your incurable personal health problems, "being brutally attacked", being "black listed" in the film industry, and about outside unknown people being fired from HBO because of drug use. You also inform the professor that someone "has threatened to rape me and slash my face..." In a different email to the Mr. Carrasco, you wrote that someone was threatening you online and they had some connection with SMC, and you stated that while you were working on a film about the World Trade Center, "they worked me 2 ½ hour days with no food and I had cancer".

This type of off-topic and non-solicited information is not relevant to your Film 32 course. It is more appropriate to discuss such personal experiences with legal counsel, law enforcement agencies and/or professional therapists, not SMC teachers or other college staff members.

Pursuant to Administrative Regulation 4410, **this letter constitutes as a final warning** for the violation of your Disciplinary Probation period, and the college's Rules of Student Conduct.

You are hereby notified that:

- If you violate the student conduct code again, by sending inappropriate emails as mentioned above, or any variation of said student conduct code, you will be suspended for from Santa Monica College for one school year.

While you are attending Santa Monica College, you assume responsibility to conduct yourself in a manner compatible with the College's function as an educational institution.
